We are offering one \$1000 scholarship in the spring of 2018. To be eligible for the White Mountain Audubon Society Scholarship you must:

1. Be a senior at one of the high schools in the White Mountain Audubon region or be a home-schooled student residing in the same region who is completing their final year of the high school curriculum.
2. Be making satisfactory progress toward graduation.
3. Be planning on continuing your education next year by attending a university, college, junior college, technical school or other recognized training program.
4. Be pursuing a career, which has the potential of having a significant positive effect on the environment.
5. Complete a 500-1000 word typed, double-spaced essay discussing your commitment to conservation, resource management, or environmental issues.
6. Agree to participate in a personal interview conducted by the scholarship committee if such is deemed necessary to decide among closely qualified applicants.
7. Agree to the publication of your essay in Audubon and/or news publications.
8. Agree to provide follow-up information to an Audubon mentor during your training period.

If you feel you meet the above criteria, please:

1. Answer the question on the next page (neatly written, in ink) or typed.
2. Attach verification from your school counselor as to your compliance with #2 in above section.
3. Attach your completed typed double-spaced essay to this form.
